Inquest into the suicide of James Matthews

SUICIDE: Mr Sylvester, coroner, held an inquest at Keevil, on James Matthews, aged 48 years. The deceased sometime since suffered a severe injury of the head, and from its effects he had never entirely recovered; he had been working also as a mower, and had been occasionally intemperate; he had recently been incoherent in his behaviour and depressed. He was found hanging on Monday, at five o'clock a.m., in his father's scullery; and had provided a second rope for his use in case the first failed

Verdict, "Suicide under temporary derangement.
