

## Swindon & District Directory Extract 1928 Kemble



KEMBLE, which is mentioned in Domesday Book as "Kimble", is four miles from Cirencester, 8 from Malmesbury and 91 from London. It is a scatted village, and includes the hamlet of Ewen. It was formerly on the extreme border of Wiltshire, but from April 1st, 1897, by an order of the Local Government Board, it was annexed to the county of Gloucester. It is the Cirencester and Tewkesbury Parliamentary Division, the Cirencester Petty Sessional Division and County Court districts.. and in the Rural Deanery and Archdeaconry of Cirencester and Diocese of Gloucester. The G.W.R. Main line to Gloucester runs through the parish, and the Stations a junction for the two branch lines of Tetbury and Cirencester. One of the sources of the Thames, named Thames Head, is in the parish. The Church of All Saints rebuilt in 1877-8 at a cost of £2,000. is an edifice in the Early English style, consisting of chancel, nave of two bays, north aisles and south transept, south porch and a western tower containing five bells, and is surmounted by a spire 120 feet in height. In the church is an ancient tomb of a Knight Templar and many interesting monuments, including a beautiful triple window of the 13th century, supposed to have been brought from Salisbury Cathedral. The porch. which is unusually large, was built in the time of Henry III. (1216-72). Over the entrance is a beautiful Norman arch. The register dates from the year 1769, and the church contains a list of vicars from the year 1327. The living is a vicarage of the yearly value of £192, arising from glebe, in the gift of Lord Biddulph. The charities for the poor amount to about £30 yearly. Lord Biddulph, who is Lord of the Manor, and Mr. William Price Jones are the principal landowners. The acreage of the parish is 3,068 acres; rateable value£5,377; population, 528. Letters arrive through Cirencester at 7 a.m. and 4 p.m., and are despatched at 9.5 a.m. and 5.40 p.m. Collection on Sundays at 6.45 p.m.. There is a Telephone Exchange here. The wall letter box at Ewen is cleared at 7.35 a.m. an 6 p.m.. A public elementary school (mixed) was erected in 1875, and enlarged in 1890 and 1899.

KEMBLE WICK is a hamlet one mile from Kemble and two miles from Oaksey. Letters arrive through Cirencester, and are despatched at 8.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m.

EWEN is a hamlet one mile east, the principle residence being that of Mrs. R. D. Cumberland-Jones, who is also a landowner.
