Landford

LANDFORD is a parish bordering on Hampshire, on a branch of the river Test, and on the road from Salisbury to Southampton, 5.5 miles from Downton station on the Alderbury and Wimborne section, and 6 miles south from Dean station on the Eastleigh and Salisbury branch of the London & South Western railway, 10 south-east from Salisbury and 7 west from Romsey, in the Southern division of the county, Frustfield hundred, Salisbury union and county court district, Salisbury and Amesbury petty sessional division, rural deanery of Amesbury (Alderbury portion), and Salisbury archdeaconry and diocese. The church of St Andrew, rebuilt in 1858, at a cost of £1500, is an edifice of brick and stone, in the Early English style, and consists of chancel, nave, south transept, and a western bell turret, containing a peal of 6 tubular bells: there are 180 sittings. The register dates from the year 1671. The living is a rectory, net yearly value, £165, with residence, and 7 acres of glebe, in the gift of Earl Nelson and held since 1910 by the Rev. John Shelly MA of Oriel College, Oxford. Landford House, the property of Douglas Eyre esq, is the residence of Panizzi P Preston esq. Douglas Eyre esq, who is lord of the manor, and Mrs Wigram are principal landowners. The soil is chiefly gravel, sub-soil sand and gravel. The chief crops are wheat, barley and turnips. The area of Landford and Earldoms is 2756 acres; rateable value of Landford £2532: the population of the ecclesiastical parish in 1911 was 336 and 407 in the civil parish, including Earldoms.

EARLDOMS, 1.5 miles north-west, formerly a civil parish, is now a hamlet in this parish. The place, with a population of 22 in 1911, is reputed to be extra-parochial for ecclesiastical purposes.
