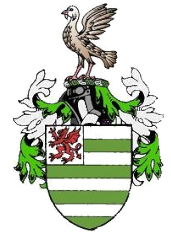




# Kellys Directory Extract 1915



## Laverstock

**LAVERSTOCK** is a parish on the banks of the river Bourne, about 1 mile north-east of Salisbury, in the Southern division of the county, hundred of Alderbury, Salisbury and Amesbury petty sessional division, Salisbury union and county court district, Amesbury rural deanery (Alderbury portion), and Salisbury archdeaconry and diocese. The church of St Andrew, erected near the site of the old church at a cost of £2353, is an edifice of stone and cut flint with Bath stone dressings, and consists of chancel, nave of three bays, south aisle, south porch, and a western turret containing 2 bells: the east and south windows are stained, and in the porch is a marble monument to the Bathurst family: a vestry was added in 1906, at a cost of £300, defrayed by the parishioners: there are 250 sittings: in the church yard, which has been enlarged, stands a portion of a buttress of the old church. The register dates from the year 1726. The living is a perpetual curacy, in the gift of the Vicars Choral of Salisbury, net yearly value £175, and held since 1901 by the Rev. Arthur Ernest Aldworth MA of Worcester College, Oxford, who resides at Milford. Mrs Wyndham-Long is lady of the manor and chief landowner. The soil is light loam, sub-soil, chalk: the chief crops are wheat and barley. The area is 2447 acres of land and 5 of water, rateable value including Ford, £6708. The population in the civil parish was 505 and 451 in the ecclesiastical parish, including 36 inmates and 22 other occupants of a private asylum.

**FORD** is a tithing, about 2 miles north.

By the New Sarum (Extension) Order 1904, which came into operation 9th November, 1904, part of Milford Without was added to Laverstock parish.
