



Fatal Accident

A poor fellow named Henry Martin, who was run over by a waggon on Wednesday in last week, died on the following Sunday morning. It appears that some portion of the harness gave way while descending a hill, the horses started, and the wheel passed over him, breaking three ribs, and crushing his chest. He lingered in agony till Sunday.

He bore a good character and held a position among the Dissenting body. On Sunday evening, the Rev. H. Munn, while preaching at the chapel-of-ease at Coate, alluded to this sad accident, and bore testimony to the uprightness of the deceased's character. He was not an attendant at church, being a member of another religious community, but he (Mr. Munn) believed him to be a true Christian.
