Little Cheverell



LITTLE CHEVERELL is a parish, 1 mile west-south-west from Lavington station and 6.5 south from Devizes station on the Great Western railway, in the Eastern division of the county, Swanborough hundred, Devizes petty sessional division, union and county court district, rural deanery of Potterne (Potterne portion), archdeaconry of Wilts and diocese of Salisbury. The church of St Peter, entirely rebuilt, with the exception of the tower, in 1850, at the joint expense of the late Earl of Radnor and the then rector, is an edifice of grey stone, in the Early English style, consisting of chancel, Perpendicular style, containing a good clock, placed in 1887, and two bells. The register dates from the year 1653. The living is a rectory, net yearly value £181 arising from 190 acres of glebe, with residence, in the gift of the Bishop of Salisbury and Charles S. Awdry esq. is lord of the manor, and the land is held by several owners. The soil is a brown sand; subsoil, green sand. The chief crops are wheat, barley, potatoes and turnips. The area is 1,025 acres; rateable value, £1,067; population in 1911, 185.
