



Post Office Directory Extract 1855 Great Cheverell



LITTLE CHEVERELL, a parish in the same jurisdiction [as Great Cheverell], 1¼ miles west-south-west from Market Lavington and 5½ south from Devizes, contained, in 1851, 252 inhabitants, and 933 acres of land. The living is a rectory, in the archdeaconry and diocese of Salisbury, of the annual value of £405, and in the patronage of the Earl of Radnor, who is also lord of the manor. The Rev. John Roles Fishlake, M.A., is the present incumbent. The church of St. Peter is a neat edifice, with a small pointed tower. Here is a National school.
