Marriage of the Rev. G. C. Keble and Miss Dunn

A large congregation assembled at midday on Tuesday in St Paul's Church, Clifton, to witness the marriage of the Rev. George Clarke Keble, rector of Little Hinton and Miss Ann Catharine Dunn, eldest daughter of Mr N. J. Dunn. Of Clifton.

The bridegroom was for five years curate at St. Mary Redcliff, and was universally esteemed by the parishioners. The service was choral. The bride who was given away by her father, was attended by six bridesmaids – the Misses J. M. Dunn, F. R. Dunn, and F. M. Dunn (sisters), and the Misses Mary, Janet and Lucy Keble (sisters of the bridegroom). The bridegroom was attended by his brother, the Rev. Thomas Keble, of Wolverhampton, as best man.

The matrimonial hymn, "The Voice that breathed o'er Eden" having been sung, the ceremony was proceeded with, the officiating clergy being the Rev. Thomas Keble, rector of Bisley, father of the bridegroom, Canon Mather, and the Rev. C. E. Cornish. After the wedding breakfast Mrs Dunn held a reception at 7 West Mall, and during the afternoon the Rev. and Mrs G. C. Keble left for Cornwall, where they will spend the honeymoon. Amongst the numerous and costly presents were a revolving bookcase, given by the Redcliff clergy past and present, and a cruet stand and silver sugar sifter, by parishioners of Bisley.
