Hinton Parva, or Little Hinton, a village, township and parish, in the Hundred of Elstub and Everley, Highworth Union, North Wilts, distant 4 miles south-west of Shrivenham Station, 75 from London, and 6 east from Swindon, containing, in 1851, 354 inhabitants, and 1,815 acres of land. The church is a plain building in the Norman style. The living is a rectory, value £100, in the presentation of the Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, in the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol; the incumbent is the Rev. John Harlington, M.A.
