

Kellys Directory Extract 1915 Littleton Drew



LITTLETON DREW is a parish and village on the Gloucestershire border, and near the great Roman road of Fosse Way, from Bath to Cirencester, 2 miles south from Badminton station, 7.5 north-west from Chippenham station on the Great Western railway, and 10 miles south-west from Malmesbury, in the North Western division of the county, Chippenham hundred, union, and petty sessional division and county court district, and in the rural deanery of Chippenham, archdeaconry of North Wilts, and diocese of Bristol. The line of railway constructed by the Great Western Co from Wootton Bassett to the Severn Tunnel, passes a little north of the village. The church of All Saints is a building of stone, in the Decorated and Perpendicular styles, consisting of chancel, nave, south porch, and a central embattled tower, containing 3 bells: in the church is an altar tomb with recumbent effigy of a lady: there are 100 sittings. The register dates from the year 1706. The living is a rectory, net yearly value £264 including 68 acres of glebe, with residence, in the gift of the Bishop of Bristol, and held since 1904 by the Rev Robert Ernest Bentley. The Duke of Beaufort is lord of the manor, and the principal landowner. Lt Col Sir Audley Dallas Neeld Bart CB, MVO, JP is also a landowner. The soil is clayey, sub-soil clay. The greater part of the parish is pasture land; the area is 979 acres; rateable value £767; the population in 1911 was 144. The Gib, 1 mile south-east, East Dunley & West Dunley, 1 mile south-east, are hamlets of the parish.

Post Office:- Miss Fanny Nation, sub-postmistress. Letters through Chippenham are delivered at 7.40am & 7.5pm; no Sunday delivery; the nearest money order office is at Acton Turville and Burton the nearest telegraph office.

Elementary School (mixed) with residence for mistress, erected about 1845 for 46 children; mistress, vacant
