Longbridge Deverill 1800-1849

1829

Wilts Lent Assizes Thomas Cooper, for stealing a couple of fowls, the property of William Charlton at Longbridge Deverill, 2 months imprisonment. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 12 March 1829**

1837

Committed to the New Prison, Devizes Thomas Cowley and John Adlam, both of Longbridge Deverill, for two months each, for destroying game in their parish. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 5 October 1837**

1838

Committed to the New Prison, Devizes John Barber, for two months, for destroying game, at Longbridge Deverill **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 12 April 1838**

1839

Committed to the New Prison, Devizes William Dyer, of Upton Lovell, and Robert Mattock, of Longbridge Deverill, for two months each, for destroying game. **Wiltshire Independent, 21 November 1839**

1841

At a petty Sessions held at Warminster on Thursday last.... and John Chislett, of Longbridge Deverill, was fined 20s for wiring trout; and in default of payment, he was committed to the House of Correction for one month. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 11 February 1841**

Committed to the New Prison Devizes. John Chislett, for one month, for destroying fish, the property of the Marquess of Bath, at Longbridge Deverill. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 11 February 1841**

1843

Committed to the New Prison Devizes Esau Payne and Joseph Adlam, for six weeks each, and John Gray, for one month, for maliciously destroying a quantity of underwood at Longbridge Deverill, the property of the Most Honourable John Alexander, Marquis of Bath. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 19 January 1843**

1847

Committed to the New Prison Devizes James Bass, for one month, for having assaulted Thomas Elliott at Longbridge Deverill. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 12 August 1847**

Committed to Fisherton Gaol. John Payne, of Longbridge Deverill, for stealing a quantity of butter, cheese, &c., the property of George Hayter. **Devizes and Wiltsire Gazette, 23 September 1847**

Committed to Fisherton Gaol. Joseph Wheeler, of Longbridge Deverill, three months, for leaving his family chargeable to the parish. **Devizes and Wiltsire Gazette, 23 September 1847**

1849

Wilts Quarter Sessions Imprisonment: Three months: Henry Johnson and George Pledger (the latter to be once whipped) stealing various articles of wearing apparel, at Longbridge Deverill. **Reading Mercury, 27 October 1849**
