### *Ludgershall* *1800-1899*

**1841**

Mr. T. A. Smith, of Tedworth House, with his usual liberality, gave 200 bushels of coals to the poor of the parish of Ludgershall during the late severe weather. This gift has been received by the poor creatures to whom it was dispensed with greater gratitude, since Mr. Smith has no land, or any interested whatever in the parish, but was solely moved to this act of generosity by witnessing the destitution of the poor.

**Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 1 February 1841**

J. H. Everett, Esq., of Biddesden House, has, during the late severe weather, given two hundred and forty bushels of coals to the poor of the parish of Ludgershall. Miss Everett, also of Biddesden, has been visiting the poor of Ludgershall, and supplied them with sheets, blankets, and clothing, in the most liberal manner.
