



Coal Distributed to the Poor 1826

On Friday se'nnight four tons of coals were distributed amongst the poor of Ludgershall, bequeathed by the will of the late Mrs. Everett, of Bedford Square, London.

At Christmas last, Mr. Everett, of Biddesden House, son of the above charitable lady, distributed amongst the poor families of Ludgershall a liberal supply of beef, bread and coals.

A great benefit is also extended to the humbler class in Ludgershall by two excellent free schools established by Mr. Everett, Sir Sandford Graham, and the Rev. Allen Hutchins.
