



CORONERS INQUESTS



Daniel Dobbs 1837

On Tuesday, Mr. Whitmarsh held an inquest at Ludgershall, on the body of Daniel Dobbs, who fell down, while partaking of his dinner, and died within an hour afterwards.

The knowledge that Dobbs lived on very unhappy terms with his wife, coupled with the circumstance of his awfully sudden death, gave rise to reports that he had been poisoned, and much interested was excited at the inquest; but it was clearly and satisfactorily proved by the surgeon that he died of apoplexy.

The Jury therefore returned their verdict accordingly.
