





Other Significant Information
Charles Henry Lansley married Elsie Blackman on 7th April 1915 at Pewsey
Frederick Charles James Lansley, their son was born on the 1st February 1916 in Ludgershall
Elsie Maud Lansley remarried to Sidney W. Tancock in the 18th May 1918 in Pewsey and later moved to Swansea, Glamorganshire
On the 26th September 1919 the following items were returned to the widow at Ludgershall - 2 discs, letter and small notebook
The British War and Victory Medals were sent to deceased's widow on 17th September 1921
