# At No. 11 Stationary Hospital, Rouen, France

Walter Harold Charles, the second dearly beloved son of Mr and Mrs Charles Perry, Andover Road, Ludgershall, aged 18 years and 5 months, passed most peacefully away June 14. ### Death of a Young Soldier

At the beginning of this week Mr and Mrs Charles Perry, of Andover Road, were informed of the death of their second son, Walter Harold Charles, at No. 11 Stationary Hospital, Rouen, aged 18 years 5 months, after only 13 days in France. Walter joined up 5 months ago and was sent to the Hants Regt. He was in quarantine at Perham Hospital for 3 weeks and then went to to Rollestone. From that camp he proceeded to Ipswich and although feeling very ill he embarked for France. Arrived there he was taken with influenza and on June 14, the Sister-in-charge of his ward wrote to Mrs Perry: "I am deeply grieved to have to tell you the sad news of the death of your son, Pte Walter C. H. Perry, who died of pneumonia this morning. I wrote to you yesterday telling you of his admission and illness, so I expect you will be fearing the worst. He was quite conscious till just before the end and asked me yesterday to write you, although poor boy he was feeling too ill to talk much. I need not tell you we did everything we possibly could for him, but it proved of no avail. He will be buried with full military honours in the graveyard here. I deeply sympathise with you in this great trouble, and I trust your loss may be your darling boy's even greater gain". Andover Advertiser 21 June 1918
