Previously reported wounded and missing, now certified killed in action August 8<sup>th</sup> Pte Edward Joseph Scanlan, A.S.C. attached London Regt, the dearly loved husband of Florence Scanlan, Butt Street, Ludgershall. Do not ask us if we miss him, there is still a vacant place; And we cannot forget his footsteps, or his loving smiling face; Too far, dear boy, thy grave to see, but not too far to think of thee. From his sorrowing wife and child.
