In action at Lindenhock, France on 12 March 1915 Died at No 7 Field Ambulance, Locre (now Loker)</p> <p>Widow Bertha, living at 16 Bell Street, Ludgershall was sent his personal possessions on 18 Oct 1915 - purse, pipe, clasp, knife, comb, whistle, lighter, pair scissors, letters.</p> <p>Awarded a pension of 10/- a week wef 27 Sep 1915. James had completed 13 years, 276 days in the Army.</p> <p>Mother re-married James Jury 1903 (27 years her junior); they emigrated to Canada in 1907 with Elsie, Nellie and William</p> <p>Commemorated: Ludgershall War Memorial, St James' Church Memorial Plaque, Salisbury Cathedral Book of Remembrance</p> <p>LCpl James Ware, 3rd Worcestershire Regiment Beloved husband of Bertha Ware of Ludgershall who died on active service March 15th 1915 age 35. Loved by all. Andover Advertiser 26 March 1915</p>
