THE LYDIARD WOODS ESTATE was offered for sale by auction, on Monday, at the Queen's Hotel, New Swindon, by Mr. Alfred White, of Basingstoke. The auctioneer having failed to sell the first lot, eleven acres of land, the property was offered in one lot, consisting of 655a, 0r. 11p., which included two valuable stock and corn farms, with a capital sporting residence, nine cottages, and the well-known Lydiard Woods. There being no offer for the estate as a whole. Flaxlands Farm was next put up, consisting of 215a. 2r. 25p., producing a yearly rent of £360. The timber, saplings, underwood, and plantation on this lot were valued at £1000. No bid was made, and lot three was submitted, consisting of the Lydiard Woods, the sporting residence known as Echo Lodge, two five-roomed and two four-roomed cottages, the area being 368a. 0r. 21p. The timber, &c., had been valued at £9.180. This property did not gain a bid. Lot four was then offered, the Home Farm 61a. 0r. 31p. producing £90 per annum, with three cottages producing £16 2s.; the timber being valued at £115. There was no offer for this lot either. The auctioneer said he had offered the whole of the lots, and having had no bidders he could do no more. He should, however, be pleased to treat privately for the sale of the property, and he understood there were persons who wished to do so. The general impression in the district was that the Meux trustees would have purchased the property, which is contiguous to their estates. The local agents of the trustees – Mr. John Humphries and Mi. A. R. Humphries - were present, but they made no sign. Probably negotiations may be made privately, and as the trustees are liberal landlords, no doubt the existing tenants would like the property to pass into their hands.
