COMMITTED TO FISHERTON GAOL

James Coles, of Maddington, charged with stealing a quantity of hay, the property of John Andrew Ingram at Knooke.

(Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette – Thursday 24 February, 1842)

James Coles was found guilty of having stolen half a hundred weight of hay, the property of Mr Ingram, at Knook, and a previous conviction having been put in, he was sentenced to ten years' transportation.
