

Stage Wagon Falls Into River At Maddington

On Thursday last as one of Mr Lye's stage wagons was passing from London to Warminster through Maddington, the turnpike-road being much undermined by the river washing against its bank, the ground gave way, which caused the wagon to fall over into the river; fortunately the horses did not receive any material injury, but part of the loading was considerably damaged by the fall and lying in the water. We understand the surveyor of this tract had notice given him of the dangerous state of this part of the road, and that his suffering it to remain unrepaired, will now probably be investigated.
