NEW CATTLE PLAGUE REGULATIONS.

The cattle plague restrictions are being considerably relaxed, a new Order in Council having been issued, making important changes. For the future a simple declaration only will be required to procure a license, the testimony of two neighbouring farmers being dispensed with. The new order authorizes superintendents of police in divisions, inspectors, and sergeants in charge of sub-divisions, to sign movement and market licenses the same as justices of the peace, provided only that there has been no case of cattle plague within a mile for two months. Movement licenses may be granted for 28 days, and cattle may be moved from sunrise to sunset from March to September, and from six to six in the other months of the year. The police have power to apprehend any drover having a forged pass, and to detain his cattle. We append a list of those from whom orders may now be obtained in this county:-
