Inquests held by Mr. Coroner Sylvester

At Manningford Abbotts, on Maria Newman, aged 60. The deceased lived alone; and on Sunday morning, as she did not make her appearance as usual, a neighbour got into the house through a window, and found her lying dead on her face upon a heap of straw. She was subject to epileptic fits, and it was supposed she had an attack, and falling upon the straw, was suffocated. Verdict - "Accidental death."
