<b>Parents</b>	John and Anne Newman (Both living at Manningford)
<b>Religion</b>	Church of England
<b>Ability to Read and Write</b>	Neither
<b>State of Bodily Health, Strength and Probable Usefulness</b>	Good
<b>Arrival Date</b>	28 <sup>th</sup> July 1854
<b>Vessel</b>	Plantagenet
<b>Relatives in the Colony</b>	None
<b>Remarks</b>	Joseph travelled out with his younger brother Evan Newman and a cousin Charles Newman. Joseph paid £1 for his passage.

**OPC Note:** Joseph, the son of John and Anne Newman, had been baptised at Manningford Abbots on 31<sup>st</sup> December 1827.
