| <b>Remarks</b>  | Ellen travelled out to New South Wales with her mother (Mary) and her siblings (Henry John and William). Another brother (Tory) was born during the voyage. Her father Richard Osland had died in 1843. |

**OPC Note:** No baptism has ever been found for Ellen Osland. On the 1841 census, Ellen is recorded as living with her mother and grandfather (Isaac Macklin) in Manningford Bohune under the surname Macklin.
