<b>Birth Year</b>	1831 (See note on Baptism below)
<b>Age on Embarkation</b>	22
<b>Gender</b>	Male
<b>Occupation</b>	Farm Labourer
<b>Native Place and County</b>	Maniford [Manningford Bohune], Wiltshire
<b>Parents</b>	John and Elizabeth [Macklin] (Both living at Maniford)
<b>Religion</b>	Church of England
<b>Ability to Read and Write</b>	Neither
<b>State of Bodily Health, Strength and Probable Usefulness</b>	Good
<b>Arrival Date</b>	2 <sup>nd</sup> March 1855
<b>Vessel</b>	Ascendant
<b>Relatives in the Colony</b>	None
<b>Remarks</b>	Henry travelled out to New South Wales as a single male, paying £1 for his passage (in company with the Bailey brothers, also from Manningford Bohune).

**OPC Note:** Henry Macklin, the son of John and Elizabeth Macklin of Manningford Bohune, had been baptised at North Newnton on 20<sup>th</sup> March 1831.
