Market Lavington 1800-1849

1823

Committed to the Old Bridewell, Devizes William Ellis, charged with stealing 8 fowls and a willow basket, the property of Mr. William. Smith, of Market Lavington.

1833

Committed to the Old Bridewell, Devizes Thomas Carter and William Asher, charged with stealing 6 quartern loaves, the property of John Gauntelett of Market Lavington

Gazette, 21 November 1833

1846

John Potter was fined 40s. (including costs) for assaulting Jacob Giddings of Market Lavington. A quarrel, it appeared, had arisen out of a pig-dealing transaction, in which Potter thought that the complainant had taken advantage of him, and shewed his resentment by using his fists.

Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 19 March 1846

For Trial William Godden, charged with stealing one gallon of peas, the property of James Beaven at Market Lavington Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 16 April 1846

1847

Committed to the New Prison, Devizes. Thomas Mead, for one month, for leaving his family chargeable to the parish of Market Lavington. Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 23 September 1847
