1875

The vicarage of Chicklade, in the gift of the Marquis of Bath, has been accepted by the Rev G W Tayler, MA, one of the masters of Marlborough College. **Western Gazette Friday 31 December 1875**

1881

The trunk of a walnut tree of large girth standing in the carpenter's yard at Marlborough College has been completely split in two by the severe frost. **The Marlborough Times 29 January 1881 (Reprinted 26th January 1956)**

1886

The rectory of Chicklade, Wilts, in the gift of the Marquis of Bath, value £235 and a house, population 97, has become vacant by the death of the Rev G W Tayler, formerly Assistant Master of Marlborough College, who was instituted in 1876. **Hampshire Advertiser Saturday 31 July 1886**

1890

Epidemic --- Diphtheria is very prevalent in some parts of Wiltshire. It has broken out at Marlborough College; but prompt measures have been taken to arrest the progress of the disease. In the village of Seend the schools have had to be closed, most of the children being afflicted. **Bath Chronicle and Weekly Gazette Thursday 30 October 1890**
