Marlborough 1800-1849

1835

On Saturday the 22nd instant, as Mr William Church, of Golden Farm, near Burbage, was returning from Marlborough Fair, he was stopped by three men, at a place called Great Lodge Hill, in Savernake forest, who pulled him from his horse, and after robbing him of three sovereigns and some silver, made their escape into the Forest. The same evening, Mr Hooper of Pewsey, and a friend, were also attacked on their return home by three men, (supposed to be the same individuals), who robbed them of two or three pounds. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 3 September 1835**

1843

Wilts Epiphany Sessions Thomas Cook, charged with having stolen a waistcoat, the property of George Greenaway, at Marlborough. Guilty: 6 months imprisonment. **Wiltshire Independent, 12 January 1843**

1843

Wilts Epiphany Sessions John Ind and George Ind, charged with having stolen four lambs, the property of John Hopson, at Marlborough; further charged with having stolen one lamb, the property of Harry or Henry Hitchcock, at Wilton. Guilty: John Ind, 18 months imprisonment, George Ind, 10 years transportation. **Wiltshire Independent, 12 January 1843**

1846

Committed To Marlborough Bridewell. Louis Dourmeer and Antonio Navares, for 14 days each, for vagrancy at Marlborough. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 19 March 1846**

Committed To Marlborough Bridewell. Henry Jennings, for seven days, for a misdemeanor in the union workhouse at Marlborough. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 19 March 1846**
