

Destructive Fire at Marlborough

On Thursday morning, about seven o'clock, a most destructive fire broke out in a yard in the occupation of Messrs. J. and M. Band, fellmongers; the premises are very extensive, and were soon enveloped in flames, and so dense was the smoke, &c., that scarcely anything could be saved; the range of workshops, warehouses, and sheds, were entirely destroyed; and goods, to the value of £700, were packed up ready to send off, but all fell a prey to the destructive element.

We regret to announce that the Messrs. Band are uninsured, and that their loss will amount to nearly £1,000.
