1815

On Tuesday was married, at Marlborough by the Rev. Cranley Kerby, William Francis Norton, Esq. of Somerton, to Marianne youngest daughter of the Rev. L. Kerby, late Rector of Castle Eaton, Wilts, and sister to the late P. Kerby, Esq. of this city. Hampshire Chronicle, Monday, 3 August 1815

1821

1827

1828

Married, Rev. T. Bullock of Castle Eaton, to Ellenor, third daughter of T. Morris of Marlborough. Bath Chronicle and Weekly Gazette, Thursday, 10 July 1828
