Marston Meysey

THIS village is situated 3 miles from Cricklade, which is the nearest railway station, and is in the Chippenham Division of Wilts, Cricklade & Wootton Bassett Union. Cirencester County Court District, Cricklade Petty Sessional Division, and Diocese of Gloucester. The register of the Church of St. James dates from 1742. The living, a vicarage, with parsonage house and net annual income of £65, is in the gift of the Rector of Meysey Hampton. The Ecclesiastical Commissioners (who are Lords of the Manor) Major Hamilton Stubber, and Mr. J. Rickards are the principal landowners. Letters through Cricklade. Letter box is cleared at 8 a.m. and 4.50 p.m. weekdays, and 5 p.m. Sundays. The nearest Money Order Office is at Kempsford, and the nearest Telegraph Office Down Ampney. Postal Orders are issued and paid here. Area, 1,334 acres; rateable value £1,557; population in 1921, 222.
