In the Name of God Amen I John Gibbs of Melksham in the County of Wilts Innholder being sick and weak in Body but of sound Mind Memory and Understanding do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following (that is to say) All my Goods and Chattels Stock in Trade Credits Money and wearing Apparel I give and bequeath unto my brother Thomas Gibbs and John Gale of the said Parish of Melksham Yeoman but In Trust for the use and benefit of Everist my beloved Wife for and during her natural Life if she shall so long continue my Widow and my Will and meaning is that if she keep unmarried during her natural Life that then and in such Case She may and shall have such Power and Authority to make a Will and dispose of all such Goods Chattels Stock in Trade Credits and Money as she shall be possessed of at the time of her Death to such Children of mine as shall be then living at her Discretion in such manner as shall best appear to her but if my Wife shall Marry then my said brother Thomas Gibbs and John Gale may and shall have full Power and Authority to take All such Goods Chattels Stock in Trade Credits Money and so forth (as by my Inventory to be made thereof soon after my Decease) that shall be then and at the time of such Marriage appear to be in her Possession and dispose thereof to such of my Children as shall be then living share and share alike ©Wiltshire OPC Project/2015/Ros Dunning
