WHITE SHEET HILL TURNPIKE ROAD

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN – That the TOLLS arising at the several Toll Gates upon the above Turnpike Road, will put up to be LET by AUCTION to the best Bidder, at the House of JOHN JEFFERY, being an Inn called or known by the name or sign of the ARUNDELL ARMS INN, at Donhead Saint Andrew, in the County of Wilts, on MONDAY, THE FIFTH DAY OF JULY NEXT, between the Hours of Eleven and Two o'clock, in the manner directed by the Acts passed in the Third and Fourth years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth, “for regulating Turnpike Roads,” such letting to commence on and from the First day of November then next, at Twelve o'clock at Noon, which Tolls produced the last year the sum of £220 above the expense of collecting, and will be put up at that sum.

Whoever happens to be the best bidder must at the same time pay one month in advance (if required) of the rent at which such Tolls may be let, and give security with sufficient sureties to the satisfaction of the Trustees of the said Turnpike Road, for payment of the rest of the money monthly.
