# Minety

**MINETY** (anciently Minty) is a parish with station (Minety and Ashton Keynes), 2 miles east of the village, on the Swindon and Cheltenham section of the Great Western railway, 85 miles from London, 8 north-west from Swindon, 8 south from Cirencester and 7 north-east from Malmesbury, in the Chippenham division of the county, hundred of Cricklade, petty sessional division, county court district, rural district and rural deanery of Malmesbury, archdeaconry of Swindon and diocese of Bristol. With the exception of a small portion in Wiltshire, it was formerly in Gloucestershire, but is now, by the Acts 2 & 3 William IV cap 64 and 7 & 8 Vict cap 61, entirely in Wiltshire.

The church of St Leonard is an ancient building of stone, in the Early English style, with traces of Perpendicular work, and consists of chancel, nave of four bays, north aisle, south porch and embattled north-western tower, with pinnacles, containing 5 bells, rehung in 1892. The pulpit, reading desk, converted out of a Jacobean pulpit desk, circa 1625, and some of the pews are elaborately carved in oak. The east and west windows are stained, and there are several memorial windows. There is a number of 18<sup>th</sup> century tablets and others, including one to those of the parish who fell in the Great War, 1914-18, and in the chancel, a framed inscription to two men of the choir who were killed in the Great War, 1914-18, The nave was new roofed in 1884, and the chancel relaid with oak and a choir vestry added in 1904. There are sittings for 200 persons.

There is a granite obelisk, at Silver Street corner, erected in memory of the men of the village who fell in the Great War 1914-18.

The register dates from the year 1663. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £334, including 11 acres of glebe, with residence, in the gift of the Archdeacon of Wilts and held since 1936 by the Rev Stanley William Emberson, B.D., of London University, A.K.C.L. The rectorial tithe, amounting to about £177 net yearly value, is now held by the Dean and Chapter of Gloucester.

The charities amount to from £30 to £35 yearly, which sum is distributed in money at the New Year to the second poor of the parish.

Minety House is the residence of Douglas H West esq., and Braydon House the property and residence of Maj. Geoffrey Henry Barrington Chance. John Mullings esq., is lord of the manor. The land is now mainly owned by the farmers.

The soil is clay and flint. The land is chiefly in pasture.

The area is 3,769 acres of land and 9 of water; rateable value, £7,496; the population in 1931 was 685.
