

## Post Office Directory Extract 1875 Minety



**MINETY** (or Minty) is an agricultural parish, and station on the Cheltenham railway, in the Northern division of the county, hundred of Cricklade, Malmesbury petty sessional division, county court district and union, diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, archdeaconry of Bristol, and rural deanery of Malmesbury North. With the exception of a small portion in Wiltshire, it was formerly in Gloucestershire but is now entirely in Wiltshire. It is 85 miles from London, 8 north-west from Swindon, 8 South from Cirencester, and 7 North-east from Malmesbury. A small portion is within the parliamentary borough of Cricklade.

The church of St Leonard is a venerable structure, in the Perpendicular style. It has chancel, nave, south aisle, and square tower. The pulpit and reading desk are elaborately carved. There is an organ.

The register dates from 1663. The living is a vicarage, yearly value £300, with residence, in the patronage of the Archdeacon of Wilts, and held by the Rev John Edwards, M.A., of St John's College, Cambridge. There is a rectorial tithe, amounting to about £260 nett yearly value, which has been made over by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Dean and Chapter of Gloucester.. The rectorial glebe has been sold to W T K Perry-Keene, esq.

A National school has been erected, supported by grants and voluntary contributions.

The charities amount to from £30 to £35 per annum, distributed in money at Christmas to the second poor of the parish.

W T K Perry-Keene, esq., resides at Minety House, and Mrs Fitzgerald at Braydon House. Captain Arthur Mullings is lord of the manor. The principal landowner is W T K Perry-Keene, esq.

The soil is clay and flint. The chief crops are grass.

The area is 3,470 acres; rateable value, £7,302; and the population in 1871 was 783.
