

Wedding Celebrations Minety

Mary Dorinda Elizabeth Ludlow-Hewitt & Canon William Preston Anslow-Sole

The wedding took place yesterday morning at the church of St James', Dauntsey, of Canon W A Sole, rector of Crudwell, and Miss Dorinda Ludlow-Hewitt, youngest daughter of the late Rev T A Ludlow-Hewitt (for many years the vicar of Minety), and of Mrs Ludlow-Hewitt, of St John's Farm, Dauntsey.

The bride is the local representative of the Woman's Land Army, a member of the WVA village ARP organisation, the Women's Institute Committee, and the Parochial Church Council. She is also deputy church organist.

The Bishop of Malmesbury (Dr R E Ramsey) officiated assisted by the rector of Dauntsey (the Rev T Curgenwen Robinson) and the Rev E R Z Walker (vicar of Lyneham), who was also the organist.

The bride, who was given away by her brother, Air Chief Marshal Sir Edgar Ludlow-Hewitt, KCB, CBE, CMG, DSO, MC, was attired in a wine-colour marocain two-piece suit, with hat and shoes to tone, and wore a spray of pink carnations.

She was attended by her sister (Mrs G H Taylor), who wore a green ensemble, and carried a bouquet of carnations and lilies of the valley. Colonel Sole (brother of the bridegroom) was the best man.

Following a reception at St John's Farm, Canon and Mrs Sole left for Devonshire, the bride travelling in a fur coat over her bridal attire.
