Transcription

I Charles Brown of Minety in the County of Gloucester Yeoman do make publish and declare this writing to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form following That is to say

My Will and desire is that all my just and lawful debts and my funeral expenses shall be paid by my herein after mentioned Executor out of my personal property

I give and bequeath unto William Hall now or late of Througham in the parish of Bisley the Sum of one hundred and fifty pounds of Lawful Money of Great Britain

I also give and bequeath unto Carolina the Wife of the late Henry Telling the Sum of Ten pounds

I also give and bequeath unto John Telling the Son of the late William Telling the Sum of Ten pounds

I also give and bequeath unto John Telling the Son of the late William Telling the Sum of Ten pounds which aforesaid three Sums of Ten pounds each shall be paid out of my personal property by my herein after named mentioned Executor at the expiration of three Months after my Death

I give and bequeath unto Thomas Huse who now is residing in the parish of Minety and as at this time has lost his eyesight the Sum of one pound a year to be paid him by my Executor out of my personal property every Christmas during the time of his natural life

I give and bequeath unto the poor of Minety the sum of five pounds a year to be paid to them by my Executor at the next two Christmases after my Death out of my personal property

All the rest and residue of my property of every description let it consist of what it may or wheresoever it may be found either Lands Money Security for Money Stock Household Furniture or any property of any sort or description I give and bequeath the same to my Nephew John Brown the Son of late Brother Thomas Brown to his own proper use and benefit which shall be at his Disposal In what manner he may think proper and I do hereby revoke and make void all former Will or Wills by me at any time heretofore made and so declare this and this only to be my last Will and Testament And by this my last Will and Testament

I do nominate appoint and declare My Nephew John Brown the Son of my late Brother Thomas Brown to be the whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament and that he shall execute it as my aforesaid Will has set forth

In witness thereof I have here unto set my hand and Seal this thirty first day of March In the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventeen

Proved at London 16th March 1825 before the Judge by the Oath of John Brown the Nephew sole Executor to whom Administration was granted having first sworn (by Commission) duly to administer
