

## Post Office Directory Extract 1855

Netheravon



Netheravon, a township, village and parish, in the hundred of Elstub and Everley, Pewsey Union, 5 miles north-bywest from Amesbury, contained, in 1851, with the tithing of Chisenbury, 551 inhabitants and 5,160 acres. The living is a vicarage, in the patronage of the Bishop of Salisbury, and of the annual value of £131; the Rev Francis Jackson Blandy MA is the present incumbent. The church of All Saints is an ancient structure, with a square embattled tower surmounted by pinnacles.

Letters received through Amesbury, which is also the nearest money order office.
