In the Name of God Amen I Samuel Arnold of Nettleton in the County of Wilts Clerk do this Eighteenth day of June in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred forty one make and Publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following (that is to say) I give to my Daughter Elizabeth now the Wife of the Reverend Richard Glasse Ten Pounds for Mourning and to my Daughter Sarah Wife of the Reverend Mr Potter Cole the like Sum of Ten Pounds for Mourning And pursuant to the Desire of my late Wife I give unto the Person who shall be Minister of the Church of Wakendon in Kent at the time of my death the Sum of Ten Pounds to be laid out for the Beautifying and Adorning of the Chancel of the said Church or about the Communion Table in such manner as my son and the said Minister shall direct I Will that the above Legacies be paid within six Months after my decease And I subject all my estate with the Payment thereof and also of such Debts as I shall owe at my death And Subject thereto I give devise and bequeath all my Money Goods Chattels and Personal Estate of what nature or kind soever And also all my Lands Tenements Hereditaments and Real Estate whatsoever unto my Son Henry Arnold his Heirs Executors and Administrators for ever And I make and appoint my said ©Wiltshire OPC Project/2013/Ros Dunning
