<b>State of Bodily Health, Strength and Probable Usefulness</b>	Good
<b>Arrival Date</b>	13 <sup>th</sup> April 1849
<b>Vessel</b>	Steadfast
<b>Relatives in the Colony</b>	Brother William living at Woodlands near Millfield
<b>Remarks</b>	Emma travelled to New South Wales with her parents and siblings (Jane, Mary & Eliza). Her brother Thomas & his wife also travelled out on the Steadfast.

**OPC Note:** Emma King was baptised at North Newnton on 29 January 1832 (transcripts have incorrectly recorded her name at Baptism as Amor).
