<b>Occupation</b>	Farm Labourer
<b>Native Place and County</b>	Hilcott, Wiltshire
<b>Parents</b>	James and Rebecca King (Mother lives in Hilcott)
<b>Religion</b>	Church of England
<b>Ability to Read and Write</b>	Neither
<b>State of Bodily Health, Strength and Probable Usefulness</b>	Good
<b>Arrival Date</b>	13 <sup>th</sup> April 1849
<b>Vessel</b>	Steadfast
<b>Relatives in the Colony</b>	Son William living at Woodlands near Millfield
<b>Remarks</b>	James travelled out to New South Wales with his wife (Ann) and Children (Jane, Mary, Eliza and Emma). His son Thomas & wife also travelled out on the Steadfast.

**OPC Note:** Although no baptism appears to exist for James, his siblings are recorded as being baptised in North Newnton both before and after his likely birthdate in 1800.
