



Alleged Embezzlement

At the County Petty Sessions, Salisbury, on Tuesday, before the Earl of Pembroke and other magistrates, Frank Foyle, a baker in the employ of Mr. John Haskell, of Nunton, was charged with embezzling the sum of £2 3s 6d, the moneys of his employer. Supt. Stephens said he was not prepared to go on with the case, as other cases had cropped up, which would lead to further charges. Prosecutor said that defendant had received the amount from Mr .Swayne, of Bodenham, between the months of May and October, but had failed to account for it. There were also other items which had come to light. The magistrates remanded the defendant for a week, but agreed to accept bail, himself in £5 and two sureties of £5 each. Defendant said he had no friends, and so no chance of getting the required sureties.
