Miscellaneous Crime Reports

- 1903** George Henry Clark
Solicitor's clerk, of Malmesbury, was brought up on a warrant charged with having, whilst assistant overseer for the parish of Oaksey, embezzled £64 9s, belonging to the ratepayers of that parish. Prisoner, who admitted the offence, was fined £60, and, on default of distress, was committed for three months' imprisonment in the second division.
Reading Mercury Saturday 24 January 1903
- 1904** Luke Baker
Of Oaksey, was charged with allowing a pony to stray on the highway in the parish of Poole Keynes. PC Hirons stated the facts. Fined 2s 6d.
Gloucester Chronicle Monday 10 October 1904
- 1904** Joseph Mayer
Labourer, of Oaksey, was charged under the Poaching Prevention Act with an offence at Kemble. He pleaded guilty, and was fined 10s.
Gloucester Chronicle Monday 14 November 1904
- 1906** Frank Hayward
Of Oaksey, labourer, pleaded guilty to being drunk at Stratton at 1 am on the 25th inst. PC Bullock stated the facts. Fined 5s, to include costs.
Gloucester Chronicle Monday 26 November 1906
- 1925** William Legg
Of Oaksey, pleaded guilty to failing to produce his motor-driving licence to PC Fry at Cirencester on May 30th and was fined 10s.

- 1926** Evelyn Daisy Wallace
Of Oaksey, was fined 15s for failing to renew a dog licence.

- 1928** George Henry Smith
Labourer, of Oaksey, pleaded guilty to having ridden a bicycle without a light in the Ewen-road, Poole Keynes, on February 20th. His explanation to PC Ralph, when stopped, was that he had used up all his carbide. Fined 5s.
Gloucester Journal Saturday 10 March 1928
- 1930** Cecil Woodward
Of Oaksey, was fined 5s for riding a bicycle without having a rear light or reflector at Poole Keynes at 9.35 pm on January 2nd.
Gloucester Journal Saturday 11 January 1930

- 1930** Robert Hurley Of School House, Oaksey, was fined 7s 6d for failing to produce motor driving licence.
Swindon Advertiser and North Wilts Chronicle Friday 21 February 1930
- 1932** William Bertram Wilson Of Oaksey, who did not appear to-day, was fined 10s for driving a motor-car at Cirencester without an up-to-date driving licence on March 25.
Gloucester Echo Wednesday 6 April 1932
- 1935** Thomas Pendlebury Cirencester's first offenders since the "silent zone" came into being were fined 5s at the local police court today. Supt A W Hopkins said that the cases were brought as a warning. There were three defendants: Thomas Pendlebury, of Oaksey, Arthur John Brown, Chipping Sodbury, and Cyril Henry Taynton, of Cheltenham. PC Robinson brought all three cases to notice. All the defendants pleaded guilty. Pendlebury said he sounded his horn accidentally. The constable said it did not sound like an accident. Each defendant had to pay 4s costs.

- 1937** J H Collings Of Oaksey, was fined 10s in each case for driving a motor-cycle not qualified for a pillion passenger and without displaying the learner mark.
Western Daily Press Thursday 9 September 1937
- 1940** Thomas Pendlebury Of Oaksey, was fined £1 for quitting his motor-car without properly setting the brakes in Market place, Cirencester, on January 4. PC Jenkins stated that the car ran off the parking place and on to the pavement.
Gloucester Echo Thursday 25 January 1940
- 1940** Joan Muriel Cuff Of Oaksey, fined 10s for riding a bicycle without lights.
Gloucester Echo Thursday 10 October 1940
- 1941** John Gollinge Of Oaksey, was in his absence and on the evidence of SC Dawe, fined 7s 6d and 2s 6d costs for riding his motor-cycle without a rear light at Somerford Keynes on the night of May 14
Gloucester Echo Thursday 5 June 1941
- 1942** Albert James Jolley Of Oaksey. Fined 10s for riding a bicycle without a red rear light.
Gloucester Echo Thursday 1 January 1942
- 1942** Cecil A Woodward Of Oaksey, was fined 10s, to include costs, for driving a motor-van without a current driving licence.

- 1944** Vera Hancock Of Oaksey, was, in her absence, fined 10s for riding her bicycle on the wrong side of the road island at the Tenble on Aug 6.

- 1947** Norman Jack Sheppard A motor-van driver of Oaksey, near Malmesbury, was fined £2 for failing to conform to a "keep-left" sign.

- 1947** Audrey Clarkson Of Lower Moor Farm, Oaksey, cyclist fined 7s 6d for riding without lights.

of a bicycle
