## **Oaksey**

**Oaksey** is a village and parish, 2½ miles south from Kemble junction station on the Swindon and Gloucester section of the Great Western railway and 6 north-east from Malmesbury and 7 south-west from Cirencester, in the Chippenham division of the county, Malmesbury hundred, petty sessional division, county court district and union, and in Malmesbury rural deanery, North Wilts archdeaconry and Bristol diocese.

The church of All Saints is a building of stone, in the Early English and Perpendicular styles, consisting of chancel, nave of three bays with clerestory, south aisle, north porch and embattled western tower containing a clock and 6 bells. The east window is stained. There is some stained glass in the nave. The church affords 400 sittings. The register dates from the year 1667. The living is a rectory, net income £282, with residence and 21 acres of glebe, in the gift of Joseph Randolph Randolph esq., KC, JP, of East Court, Malmesbury, and held since 1920 by the Rev Frederick William Nicklin, B.A. of University College Durham.

There is a small Primitive Methodist chapel.

A charity of about £3 yearly is divided every other year among the poor.

Lawrence James Baker esq. JP, is lord of the manor and there are several landowners.

The soil is clay, gravel and flint. The land is chiefly in pasture.

The area is 1,820 acres of land and 7 of water; rateable value, £2,659; and the population in 1901 was 362.

Woodlands is 1 mile west-by-north.
