Oaksey

Oaksey is a village and parish, with a halt on the Swindon and Gloucester section of the Great Western railway, and 7 north-east from Malmesbury and 7 south-west from Cirencester, in the Chippenham division of the county, hundred, petty sessional division, county court district, rural district and rural deanery of Malmesbury, archdeaconry of Swindon and diocese of Bristol.

Electricity is available. Water is supplied by the Malmesbury Rural District Council.

The church of All Saints is a building of stone, in the Early English and Perpendicular styles, consisting of chancel, nave of three bays with clerestory, south aisle, north porch and embattled western tower containing a clock and 6 bells. The east window is stained. There is some ancient stained glass in the nave. The church affords 300 sittings. The register dates from the year 1662. The living is a rectory, net income £333, with residence and 20 acres of glebe, in the gift of the Bishop of Bristol, and held since 1935 by the Rev Thomas John Vincent Williams, B.A. of St David's College, Lampeter.

There is a small Methodist chapel.

A charity of about £3 yearly is divided every other year among the poor.

The principal landowners are Col Hon Sir Geoffrey Lawrence DSO, J.P., and Arthur Rich esq.

The soil is clay, gravel and flint. The land is chiefly in pasture.

The area is 1,820 acres of land and 7 of water; rateable value, £2,659; and the population in 1931 was 359.

Woodlands is 1 mile west-by-north.
