A large congregation of family, friends, colleagues and local residents attended the funeral of Jacqueline Kent at 11am on Monday at All Saints Church, Oaksey.

Jackie died, aged 44, in the Intensive Care Unit at Great Western Hospital on December 21 after a brief illness. The service was conducted by the Rev Barrie Raven. The coffin entered the church to music sung by David Bowie, with a wreath in the colours of Liverpool Football Club. Jackie has been buried in Oaksey's churchyard.

Born in Oaksey, with two brothers, Jackie was the eldest of five girls.

Jackie worked at Kemble Airfield, Dyson, and Linolite.

Many people have fond memories of Jackie and her extraordinary character. She lived life to the full and will be mainly remembered for her wicked sense of humour. She loved football and was a devoted supporter of the England team, as well as Liverpool Football Club.

Jackie took huge pride in her whole family and was very protective of them. She was a loving and caring person and doted on her nephews and nieces and the children of her best friends.

The retiring collection at the funeral will be divided between the Wiltshire Air Ambulance, and the Intensive Care Unit at Great Western Hospital.
