

Post Office Directory Extract 1875 Oaksey



Oaksey is a village and parish, in the Northern Division of the county, parliamentary borough of Cricklade, Malmesbury hundred, county court district and union, diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, archdeaconry of Bristol, and rural deanery of Malmesbury north, 6 miles south-west from Cirencester, 2 south from Cirencester junction station, 5 north-east from Malmesbury, and 93 from London.

The church of All Saints, a handsome building in the Early English style, consists of nave, south aisle, and chancel, in which is some handsome stained glass. It is lighted by clerestory windows, and has an embattled tower with 6 bells. The register dates from 1667. The living is a rectory, yearly value £420, with residence and glebe, in the gift of Capt. Arthur Mullins.

There is a National school, and the Primitive Methodists have a small chapel.

The Misses Salisbury, of Salisbury, are ladies of the manor and principal landowners.

The soil is clay, gravel and flint. The crops are chiefly grass.

The area is 1,802 acres; gross estimated rental, £4,862; rateable value, £3,988; and the population in 1871 was 452.
