1800-1849

1818

Committed to Fisherton Gaol: - John Bungey, of Odstock, labourer, and Moses Bryant, of New Sarum, labourer, charged with stealing a quantity of wheat, the property of James Absalom, at Odstock. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal 9 March 1818**

1825

Committed to the House of Correction, Devizes: - Thomas Chubb, of Odstock, for six weeks, for destroying fish, the property of the Earl of Radnor. **Devizes Western Gazette 13 October 1825**

1845

George Alussell, otherwise Musselwhite, of Odstock, for a month, for poaching. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal 29 Mar 1845**

1848

Weights and Measures – Mr Beach, the Inspector for this division, brought forward the following charges for using light weights. Reuben Bracher, shopkeeper, of Odstock, was summoned for having in use, on the 7th of April, four unstamped weights. He was fined £1 including the expenses. George Toomer, shopkeeper of the same village, was summoned for having in use seven weights, all light, and an unequal pair of scales. He was fined £2 and costs for both offences. **Hampshire Advertiser 15 April 1848**
