

Gipsies Camp at Odstock

County Petty Sessions, Tuesday, Before Earl Radnor and other magistrates.

Stephen Bull, John Bull, and John Cooper, gipsies, were summoned by the police for encamping near Odstock, contrary to the statute.

Sergt. Morgan stated that the band numbered 40 to 50 in all, mostly women and children, and that their horses were let loose in a field of clover and grass belonging to Mr Read. They were severally ordered to pay a fine of 40s and costs or be imprisoned for two months.
